

Other common forms of arthritis are gout, fibromyalgia, rheumatoid arthritis, and lupus. Symptoms include pain, aching, stiffness, and swelling in or around the joints. #### **MAJOR TAKE-AWAY POINTS**



As Jesus talked with His disciples and the multitudes, He shared what heaven would be like. He told them about the wise and the foolish virgins. The wise were ready for and stayed ready for the bridegroom. The foolish virgins were not. We don't know the day or the hour the Son of Man cometh. We must get ready and stay ready.



Many believers who are wise--they are led by the Holy Spirit. The foolish try to rely on their own intellect. You cannot make it on your own. You will not be ready. You must have the spirit of God leading you. The wise will have oil for their lamp and will not allow the fire to go out.



You don't want to be in the position where Jesus says, "I don't know you." Our salvation is the opportunity to get ready; then, living for God is our opportunity to stay ready. We must daily cultivate our relationship with Christ. We must give up our will for His will. We want to get ready and stay ready.


