- But only the high priest entered the inner room only once a year and never without blood, which he offered for himself and for the sins the people had committed in ignorance.
- The Holy Spirit was showing that the way into the Most Holy Place had not yet been disclosed as long as the first tabernacle was still functioning.
- This is an illustration for the present time, indicating that the gifts and sacrifices being offered were not able to clear the conscience of the worshiper.
- They are only a matter of food and drink and various ceremonial washings—external regulations that apply until the time of the new order.
- But when Christ came as high priest of the good things that are now already here, He went through the greater and more perfect tabernacle that is not made with human hands; that is to say, is not a part of this creation.

At the age of five, Emma saw a Black American nurse who was visiting Rafting Creek Elementary School, teaching students proper dental hygiene. This ignited her passion for medicine. From that day forward, she resolved to become a nurse.

After completing high school, Emma continued her educational journey at the University of the District of Columbia (UDC), earning an Associate Degree of Science in Nursing. While at UDC, she was elected President of the Student Nursing Association (SNA); presiding over SNA board meetings, meeting with the Dean of the College of Nursing on a regular basis. and serving as a liaison for nursing students.

She then went on to pursue a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing at Notre Dame of Maryland University, graduating with honors (*Cum Laude*). Emma started her nursing career at the Washington Hospital Center in the District of Columbia, specializing in kidney and pancreas transplants.

After many years in the Washington Metropolitian Area, she returned to her hometown of Rembert, SC, and continued her nursing career at Prisma Health Tourney, serving as a medical/surgical nurse. She later went on to work for Veteran's Rehabilitation in Columbia, SC.

Emma is currently employed by the SC Department of Health and Environmental Control (SC DHEC) for the Pee Dee Region, where she serves as a public health nurse with the COVID-19 Outreach Response Team. There, she strives to improve the quality of life for all South Carolinians by protecting and promoting the health of the public and the environment. Emma is also employed, part-time, at the MUSC-Kershaw location as a surgical nurse.

After returning home, Emma joined her beloved childhood church--Rafting Creek Baptist Church where she currently serves on the Public Relations Committee and on the Senior Missionary Ministry.
