
Lord, I thank you for hearing and answering prayers. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen.

## MINISTRY IMPACT

#### **CHURCH-GIVING TRENDS**

A Decade That Reshaped Generosity: Perceptions and Motivations Toward Giving and eGiving

Churchgoers remain driven to give by personal faith and community impact.

The following are the most frequently cited reasons for giving:

- Supporting the church community.
- Upholding Bible-based values.
- Contributing to important community work.

Over time, perceptions toward eGiving have become increasingly more positive, especially among adults ages 24 to 54.

Concerns such as "eGiving not being Christian" or "Contributions not reaching the church" have declined, although resistance among older adults (ages 55 to 72) remains somewhat stronger.

# Thanksgiving Safety Tips

For Thanksgiving 2025, let's focus on fire and food safety by staying in the kitchen while cooking, keeping children at least three feet from hot surfaces, and thoroughly cooking and refrigerating food. Also, you can practice travel safety by planning your route, ensuring your vehicle is prepared, and avoiding distractions. General safety includes keeping floors clear to prevent trips and falls and using timers for lights if you travel.

# Thanksgiving Safety Tips, continued

# Kitchen and Fire Safety

- Stay in the kitchen when frying, grilling, or broiling food. If you must leave, turn off the stove.
- Use a timer to remind yourself that the stove or oven is on.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the stove and hot food.
- Turn pot handles inward to prevent spills.
- Keep flammable items like oven mitts, towels, and curtains away from heat sources.
- Place matches, lighters, and knives out of children's reach.
- Use timers for holiday lights and never leave candles unattended.
- Keep the kitchen floor clear of clutter to prevent falls.

- Test smoke alarms before the holiday and consider purchasing a fire extinguisher.
- For deep-frying a turkey: Ensure the bird is fully thawed, use the fryer outdoors, and keep it away from any overhead cover.





# Food Safety

- Cook the turkey to the correct temperature by using a food thermometer. The internal temperature should be at least 165°F.
- Do not wash the turkey, because this can spread bacteria. The only way to kill bacteria is through thorough cooking.
- Prevent cross-contamination by keeping raw meat separate from other foods. Use separate cutting boards and wash all items that touch raw meat.
- Refrigerate leftovers promptly within two hours of serving.
- Reheat leftovers to an appropriate temperature to kill any bacteria.

# Travel Safety

- Plan your route in advance and check for potential construction or traffic.
- Perform a vehicle check and pack an emergency kit.
- Avoid driving under the influence and be mindful of potentially slick roads.
- If traveling, do not post on social media that you are away from home.
- Consider personal health and consider postponing travel if you are sick.




#### **CAREGIVING IN THE UNITED STATES, 2025**

#### **DEMOGRAPHICS**

One of every four adults is a caregiver. Of these, 94% care for adults and one in three is under age 50. Caregivers are increasingly diverse across race, income, and generation. Twenty-nine percent (29%) are sandwich generation caregivers, supporting both children and adults.

#### INTENSITY AND COMPLEXITY

Over 40% of caregivers now provide high-intensity care. Many perform complex medical tasks, such as administering injections or managing equipment, yet only 22% receive training.

#### **CAREGIVING IN THE UNITED STATES, 2025 (continued)**

#### **PAID CAREGIVERS**

For the first time, the care-givers report includes 11 million caregivers who receive some compensation through Medicaid, the VA, or other state programs. These caregivers are more likely to be younger, lower-income, and from diverse backgrounds.


#### **WORKPLACE IMPACT**

Seven of ten family caregivers are employed, but many face disruptions and lack access to supportive benefits, especially the 18 million hourly wage workers.

#### HEALTH AND FINANCIAL STRAIN

One of five caregivers report poor health; a quarter are taking on debt because of caregiving. Half report negative financial impact due to caregiving, and one in five cannot afford basic needs (e.g., food).


