Scriptures: Matthew 9:20-21; Psalm 8

"There Is No Substitute for Jesus--The Real Thing"

There is no substitute for Jesus: the real thing. Reverend Morton told us that a substitute is a person or thing, acton, or serving in the place of another. Substitutes can be negative or positive; nobody can duplicate our Jesus, for He is the real thing. Rev. Morton told us about the woman with the blood issues for 12 years but, by her faith, she was healed. He told us about many things that are not real. Parents should not be asking their children today whether they feel like going to church, but they should be taking them to church. We were told that (1) our foreparents had less, but they praised Jesus more; (2) God can use us when we hit rock bottom; (3) There is no substitute for Jesus; He is the real thing. There is the song "Jesus is real." He is real. He is real to me.

Scripture: Luke 10:33-34

"Giving or Needing Roadside Service"

Reverend Morton said this man on the side of the road showed that sin will break you down. He also said that when we shut ourself in these four walls, we feel that we have done the service. But the service does not begin and end in these four walls. It begins when we go out into the world to minister and invite others to come to Christ by sharing our testimony. When we come to church, it's to worship; when we leave, it's to serve. We must remember that Jesus said that He didn't come to be served but to be a servant. We should be meeting the needs of people. Our neighbors are people in need. The Samaritan is Jesus Christ.

Scriptures: Luke 6:46-49; Matthew 7: 21-28 "What Kind of House Are You Building?"

Reverend Morton said that to obey God is like building a house on a solid foundation. In your life, you will be tested. We have to put our trust in God. The focal scripture teaches about two men who built their houses: One built his house on the sand. When the storm came, the houseNM was washed away. The other man built his house on a solid foundation. Jesus must be the center of your house--a house of family prayer and Bible study.

What kind of material are you using? Is it the material of life--cheating, stealing, jealously,gossiping, or grief? Or is it joy, love, and prayer? Jesus is more concerned with our walk, not with our talk. We must remember that our house represents our life. In closing, Rev. Morton said that we should first clean our house. He used the following illustration:

Joy dishwashing liquid--which represents the joy that Christ brings to our lives. Awesome cleaner--Jesus is awesome.
Fantastic spray--God is fantastic.
Shout--We can shout praises to God.
Gain detergent--We gain His love.



Inspirational and Motivational Tips:
